TOWN LIAISON REPORT

- Matt O'Connor reported that Community Choice Aggregation bids are in and two competitive bids have been selected for presentation and Q&A sessions this month.
- Meet the Machines! is Saturday, May 11, 2019 at the Pittsford Community Center Parking Lot.
- Petitions have been submitted for 4-5 neighborhood refuse districts.
- The Pittsford Survey has 1200 replies so far and will be open until May 20th.

LIBRARY DIRECTOR REPORT

- Amanda Madigan thanked the Friends for all of their hard work and support of the library. Library staff received many positive comments about the Spring Book Sale.
- Programming and Outreach were highlighted. This month three readers finished the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten Challenge. Staff participated in the STEAM Day event at Jefferson Road Elementary School.
- Amanda requested a vote to approve \$2500 for Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion collection development. Ken Knight moved for approval of the Foundation fund request, Tracy Castleberry seconded and the motion carried.
- The library will have an activity booth at Paddle and Pour on Saturday, May 25th.
- The New York State Report was presented for approval with adjustments from the 2018 fiscal audit. Mary Doyle motioned for the report to be distributed and Ken Knight seconded the motion.
