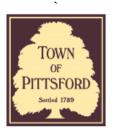

Proceedings of a regular meeting of the Pittsford Town Board held on Thursday, November 4, 2021 at 6:00 P.M. local time in the Lower Level Meeting Room of Town Hall, 11 South Main Street, in person.

ATTENDANCE: Seven members of the public in attendance.

Supervisor Smith called the Town Board meeting to order at 6:02 P.M. and invited all to join in the Pledge to Flag.

SUPERVISOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Supervisor recognized our region as the ancestral homeland of the people of the Seneca Nation, and noted the commemoration of the Treaty of Canandaigua, signed in 1794 among the Seneca, the other peoples of the Haudenosaunee Confederation and the United States.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE SUPERVISOR'S 2022 BUDGET

Supervisor Smith reviewed the proposed 2022 budget, following the same presentation made at the last Town Board meeting.

In particular, the Supervisor noted revisions to proposed budget that he has made since his initial budget presentation at the last Town Board meeting. These are:

- The addition of \$816.00 to cover the increase in fees for using East Rochester News Channel 12.
- The addition of \$2,000.00 for Design Review and Historic Preservation Board member training.
- The addition of \$3,000.00 for Martin Luther King Jr. Day events.

Supervisor Smith thanked Councilmember Beckford for his suggestions and advice on the additional funds for Design Review Board training and Martin Luther King Jr. events.

He reiterated that the budget as proposed, and including the changes noted above, cuts the Town Tax rate by an additional 2 cents, reducing it to \$3.13 per thousand dollars, from 3.15 in 2021– cumulatively since 2018, more than a 9% cut in the Town tax rate.

The Supervisor then opened the public hearing on the proposed 2022 budget. Barbara Baer and Pearl M.C. Brunt offered comments.

Hearing no further public comments, the Supervisor closed the Public Hearing and asked councilmembers if they had any comments they wished to share. Councilmember Beckford commented that funds allocated for Martin Luther King Jr. events can be shared with Juneteenth events and/or celebrations. Councilmember Townsend inquired about recreation programming. Director of Recreation Jessie Hollenbeck stated the plan is to get programming back to where it was pre-pandemic before expanding program offerings. New programs will be based on suggestions of current participants and canvassing others in the community, specifically paying

attention to our senior population. Councilmember Townsend stated that she required certain information contained in the budget in graphic format. Without this information, she was not prepared to vote on the budget.

The Supervisor noted that this delay adversely affects the County's Budget process. Without a majority of votes to pass the budget tonight, he recommended a Special Meeting of the Town Board to vote on the budget once the Finance Director furnishes the information in the format requested. Thereafter a Resolution to set a Special Meeting of the Pittsford Town Board for Wednesday, November 10, 2021 at 6:00 pm was made by Supervisor Smith, seconded by Councilmember Townsend, and voted on by members as follows: Ayes: Beckford, Koshykar, Munzinger, Townsend and Smith. Nays: none.

The Resolution was declared carried as follows:

RESOLVED, that a Special Meeting of the Pittsford Town Board will be held, Wednesday, November 10, 2021 at 6:00 pm for the purpose of considering a resolution to adopt the proposed budget for 2022.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE NYS COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG CARES ACT) FUNDING FOR SENIOR CENTER IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS.

Supervisor Smith reviewed the grant opportunity and the Town's plans for the funding should we be awarded the grant. He then opened the Public Hearing for the NYS Community Development Block Grant (CDBG CARES ACT) funding for senior center improvement projects and asked if any member of the public wished to speak. Hearing none, Supervisor Smith closed the Public Hearing, noting that the Board would take up the resolution under Financial Matters.

MEMORANDUM

Regarding: Local Law No. 3 of 2021: Cannabis Opt-Out

For Meeting On: November 16, 2021



In March 2021, the State legislature adopted the Marijuana Regulation and Taxation Act ("MRTA"). The statute created a new chapter of the State's consolidated laws, the Cannabis Law, which establishes new State offices and a licensing system, and comprehensively regulates different aspects of the use of medicinal and adult-use cannabis and hemp.

Under Cannabis Law § 131, any town, city, or village may adopt a local law, no later than December 31, 2021, opting out of allowing the establishment of adult-use cannabis retail dispensaries and/or on-site consumption sites within the jurisdiction of such town, city, or village.

If a municipality fails to opt out by the end of this year, it can never opt out in the future, but if a municipality opts out this year and wants to opt in some time in the future, it may do so by passing a new local law repealing the opt-out local law.

There is the potential for municipalities to gain some tax revenue from the sale of cannabis from retail dispensaries. But the licensing of these dispensaries will be exclusively controlled by a new State board, the Cannabis Control Board. While municipalities may regulate the "time, place and manner" of the operation of retail dispensaries and/or on-site consumption sites, any such local regulation may not make the operation of such dispensaries or consumption sites "impracticable as determined by the [B]oard."

Because it will take some time for the Town to carefully consider how to regulate the "time, place and manner" of operation of any adult-use cannabis facilities it may want to allow in the future, it would appear prudent for the Town to opt out now, while it can.

Submitted herewith is a proposed local law to have the Town opt out of allowing adultuse cannabis retail dispensaries and on-site consumption sites from being established and operated within the Town's jurisdiction. If the Town Board wishes to move forward with setting a public hearing on this proposed local law, I suggest the following resolution:

RESOLUTION

I move that a public hearing be set for December 8, 2021 at 6:00 pm, local time, at the Town Hall, 11 South Main Street, Pittsford, New York, to consider proposed Local Law No. 3 of 2021: Local Opt-Out of Adult-Use Cannabis Retail Dispensaries and On-Site Consumption Sites within the Town of Pittsford, in accordance with the written resolution submitted herewith.

AS FOLLOWS:

LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 2021: THE ADOPTION OF PROPOSED LOCAL LAW NO. 3 of 2021: LOCAL OPT-OUT OF ADULT-USE CANNABIS RETAIL DISPENSARIES AND ON-SITE CONSUMPTION SITES WITHIN THE TOWN OF PITTSFORD

Sec. 1 Title

This local law shall be known as Local Law No. 3 of 2021: Local Opt-Out of Adult-Use Cannabis Retail Dispensaries and On-Site Consumption Sites within the Town of Pittsford.

Sec. 2 Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to opt out of allowing cannabis retail dispensaries and on-site cannabis consumption sites in the Town of Pittsford that would otherwise be allowed under Cannabis Law Article 4.

Sec. 3 Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to Cannabis Law §131, which expressly authorizes the Town Board to adopt a local law requesting the Cannabis Control Board to prohibit the establishment of cannabis retail dispensary licenses and/or on-site consumption licenses within the jurisdiction of the Town and is subject to a permissive referendum, the procedure of which is governed by Municipal Home Rule Law §24.

Sec. 4 Local Opt-Out

The Town Board of the Town of Pittsford hereby opts out of allowing cannabis retail dispensaries and on-site cannabis consumption sites from being established and operated within the Town's jurisdiction.

Sec. 5 Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation and effect to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part thereof, or in its application to the person, firm, or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy or action in which such order or judgment shall have been rendered.

Sec. 6_____Permissive Referendum/Referendum on Petition

This local law is subject to a referendum on petition in accordance with Cannabis Law §131 and the procedure outlined in Municipal Home Rule Law §24.

Sec. 7 Operative and Effective Dates

This local law shall be operative immediately upon its adoption and take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Resolution to Set Public Hearing

Ladies and Gentlemen:

From time to time over many years past, RIT Professor Emeritus William P. Johnson has provided radio frequency (RF) consulting services to the Town, primarily to the Planning Board, with respect to cellular telephone towers and other facilities. His fees for such services are typically reimbursed to the Town from the applicant before the Planning Board. Professor Johnson's expertise is unquestioned, and his services have been first rate.

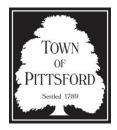
Verizon Wireless is on the verge of submitting a comprehensive application to construct several telecommunications towers and a cluster of utility pole wireless facilities in several areas around the Town. The Town's need for competent, responsive, technical advice to evaluate and respond to the application in timely fashion is critical.

Attached is the proposed "Agreement for Professional Services" which would engage Dr. Johnson's services for the next year. The attached Agreement is virtually identical to the past Agreements we have had with Dr. Johnson, except for the rate of fees in the fee schedule set forth as Schedule A to the Agreement. Please note that Dr. Johnson's hourly consulting rate has increased from \$300 to \$350, although his rate is unchanged from January 1, 2019.

Since the proposed Agreement involves a contract for professional services requiring technical expertise, competitive bidding is not required.

RESOLUTION

I move that the Town Supervisor be authorized to sign the proposed "Agreement for Professional Services" with William P. Johnson for technical review of the impending application for wireless telecommunications facilities within the Town.



AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT, is made as of the 16th day of November, 2021, by and between the Town of Pittsford, a municipal corporation having its principal office located 11 South Main Street, Pittsford, New York 14534, hereinafter referred to as the "Town" and William P. Johnson, with offices located at P.O. Box 20263, Rochester, New York 14602-0263, hereinafter referred to as the "Consultant".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town desires to secure the professional services of a Consultant to provide services required for wireless cell tower technical review, hereinafter referred to as the "Project", and,

WHEREAS, the Consultant has the necessary equipment, personnel and expertise to perform the Project.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms and conditions contained herein, the parties do covenant and agree as follows:

SECTION 1. DESCRIPTION OF CONSULTANT'S SERVICES

- A. The Consultant shall, upon the commencement date specified in Section 2 hereof, perform in a professional and workmanlike manner to the reasonable satisfaction of the Town, all of the services required below or reasonably required in order to carry out the services set forth herein:
- 1. Provide assistance to the Town's Department of Public Works, the Town's Planning Board, and the Town's Zoning Board of Appeals in the review of proposed personal wireless telecommunication facilities locations offered by service providers and/or vendors.
- 2. Verify Technical information submitted by service providers and/or vendors.
- 3. Explain technical information in laymen terms.
- 4. Appear before the Planning Board and/or Zoning Board of Appeals, as requested, in person or virtually as available.
- 5. Prepare written reports and presentation materials, as requested.
- 6. Meet with Town staff and/or service providers, as requested, in person or virtually as available.
- B. Except as otherwise specified in this Agreement, all equipment, materials and supplies required to carry out the provisions of this Agreement and to perform the services described above shall be furnished by the Consultant and shall be fit for their purpose to the reasonable satisfaction of the Town.

SECTION 2. <u>TERM</u>

The services required of the Consultant pursuant to this Agreement shall commence on November 16, 2021 and shall terminate on November 15, 2022.

SECTION 3. FEES

A. The Town agrees to pay and the Consultant agrees to accept as full payment for the work and services performed pursuant to this Agreement, the following payable in the following manner:

- 1. The Town shall pay and the Consultant shall accept payment for the services on a by case basis.
- 2. Payment shall be made upon submission of a fully executed voucher with an attached summary of the services.
- 3. Consulting rates shall be determined on the basis of "Schedule A".

SECTION 4. AUTHORIZED AGENT FOR THE TOWN AND THE CONSULTANT

as Authorized Agents of the Town and of the Consultant, respectively, for receipt of all notices, demands, vouchers and other communications and all orders, permissions, and directions pursuant to this Agreement, which shall be sufficiently communicated, given and/or delivered by regular mail, or delivered personally. The parties reserve the right to designate other or additional Authorized Agents upon written notice to the other party, which shall be signed by the Authorized Agent of the requesting party.

SECTION 5. INDEMNIFICATION

The Consultant hereby agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless the Town against any and all liability, loss, damage, suit, charge, attorney's fees and expenses of whatever kind or nature which the Town may directly or indirectly incur, or be required to pay by reason or in consequence of the intentionally wrongful or negligent act or omission of the Consultant, its agents, employees or contractors. If a claim or action is made or brought against the Town and for which the Consultant may be responsible hereunder in whole or in part, then the Consultant shall be notified and shall handle or participate in the handling of the defense of such matter.

SECTION 6. WORKERS' COMPENSATION AND DISABILITY BENEFITS INSURANCE

This Agreement shall be void and of no effect unless the Consultant shall secure

compensation for the benefit of, and keep insured during the life of this Agreement, any and all employees as are required to be insured under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Law of the State of New York or the state of the Consultant's residence, whichever may apply. The Consultant shall provide proof to the Town, duly subscribed by an insurance carrier, that such Workers' Compensation and Disability Benefits coverage have been secured. In the alternative, Consultant shall provide proof of self-insurance or shall establish that Workers' Compensation and/or Disability Benefits coverage is not required by submitting a completed New York State Workers' Compensation Board's form CE-200.

SECTION 10. COMPLIANCE WITH ALL LAWS

The Consultant agrees that during the performance of the work required pursuant to this Agreement, the Consultant, and all employees working under the Consultant's direction shall strictly comply with all local, state, or federal laws, ordinances, rules or regulations controlling or limiting in any way the performance of the work required by this Agreement. Furthermore, each and every provision of law and clause required by law to be inserted in this Agreement shall be deemed to be inserted herein, and this Agreement shall be read and enforced as though it were included herein. If, through mistake or otherwise, any such provision is not inserted, or is not properly inserted, then upon the application of either party this Agreement shall be forthwith physically amended to make such insertion or correction.

SECTION 11. AUDIT

The Consultant agrees that the Town shall, until the expiration of three (3) years after final payment, have access to and the right to examine any directly pertinent books, documents, papers and records of the Consultant and of any of the subcontractors engaged in the performance of and involving transactions related to this Agreement or any subcontracts.

SECTION 12. PROHIBITION AGAINST ASSIGNMENT

The Consultant is prohibited from assigning, transferring, conveying, subletting or otherwise disposing of this Agreement or any of its contents, or of any right, title or interest therein, or of the power to execute this Agreement, to any other person or corporation without the previous consent, in writing, of the Town.

SECTION 14. EXTENT OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement constitutes the entire and integrated Agreement between and among the parties hereto and supersedes any and all prior negotiations, agreements and conditions, whether written or oral. Any modification or amendment to this Agreement shall be void unless it is in writing and subscribed by the party to be charged or by the party's authorized agent.

SECTION 15. STATUS AS INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

The Consultant, as an independent contractor, covenants and agrees to conduct the work under this Agreement consistent with such status. The Consultant shall neither pretend

nor claim to be an officer or employee of the Town by reason hereof, nor make any claim, demand or application to or for any right or privilege applicable to an officer or employee of the Town, including but not limited to Workers' Compensation coverage, unemployment insurance benefits, social security coverage or retirement membership or credit.

SECTION 16. LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by and under the laws of the State of New York. In the event that a dispute arises between the parties, venue for the resolution of such dispute shall be the County of Monroe, New York.

SECTION 18. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>

If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid by a court of law, the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby if such remainder would then continue to conform to the laws of the State of New York.

SECTION 19. TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT

The performance of work under this Agreement may be terminated by the Town in accordance with this clause in whole, or from time to time in part, whenever the Consultant shall default in the performance of this Agreement in accordance with its terms. Upon termination, the Town may take over the work to be performed and complete the same by contract or otherwise, and the Consultant shall be liable to the Town for any excess cost occasioned thereby. The total fee payable to the Consultant under this Agreement upon such termination shall be such proportionate part of the total fee as the value of the work satisfactorily completed and delivered to the Town bears to the value of the work contemplated by this Agreement.

Non-legal Consulting Rate and Terms and Conditions

- Based on standard four-week lead time, consulting is billed at \$350 per hour ("Consulting Rate"). Time in attendance at meetings, preparing reports, and telephone consultation time are considered consulting. <u>Expedited schedule</u> for work due with less than four-week lead time (unless agreed upon otherwise) incurs a 20% premium on all billable consulting hours.
- 2. Travel time to and from meetings, field sites and other obligations ("Event") related to performance of the consulting agreement is billed at the reduced rate of \$175 per hour ("Travel Rate").
- 3. In addition to actual travel time at the Travel Rate, when Consultant must travel to an Event a minimum number of guaranteed consulting hours at the Consulting Rate applies to the Event. Distances are determined by mileage from the then-current location from which travel initiates and/or concludes (usually Brighton, NY).

a. 0 to 10 miles: 1 hour b. 10 to 40 miles: 2 hours c. 40 to 100 miles: 4 hours d. Over 100 miles: 4 hours or other specific minimum if so negotiated

- 4. Travel, lodging, meals, fees, and incidental expenses associated with the performance of the consulting agreement will be billed at cost. Vehicle mileage will be billed at the current IRS rate.
- 5. Invoices for consulting and other expenses will be submitted to Client at one-month intervals unless other arrangements are agreed upon. <u>Municipal Clients</u>: Invoices are due NET 45 days from date of invoicing. <u>Non-municipal clients</u>: Invoices are due and payable upon receipt from retainer funds; Client must maintain a positive retainer fund balance at all times for continuation of work. Some methods of retainer fund deposits incur bank and transfer fees. All transfer fees, charges and costs related to retainer fund deposits are deducted from the retainer. Refund of any unused retainer funds will be returned to Client by check and there will be no fees or costs incurred for this method of refund.
- 6. If requested by Consultant and upon approval of Client, Client will provide advance payment or otherwise cover certain specific out-of-pocket expenses such as but not limited to travel expenses, test equipment rental, procurement of RF propagation plots, and/or air fare needed for the performance of assignments. If Client does not agree to such prepayment, Consultant's commitment to perform specific aspects of the assignments related to such expenses are deemed waived by Client.
- 7. Client agrees that Consultant's liability for any and all matters arising from performance of the Agreement is strictly limited to the work products stated in the Agreement as long as Consultant acts with reasonable care. Consultant's liability does not under any circumstances extend to Client's actions based on Client's unilateral interpretation of the work products.

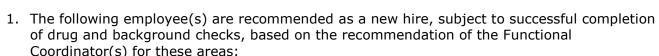
