Our annual Rabies Vaccine Free Drive-thru Clinic is tomorrow, Thursday, May 9, from 4:30 - 7:00pm at the Town Highway Garage, 60 Golf Avenue. Update your pet's rabies vaccine for free – dogs, cats and ferrets are welcome! Although cats do not require a license, NYS law requires that all vaccinate their cats against rabies. For safety, all dogs must be on a short leash (even if they're inside a vehicle); cats and ferrets must remain in a secure carrier.

## HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION & eRECYCLING THIS SATURDAY, MAY 11

**HHW drop off registration deadline is Friday**

The Town of Pittsford's annual appointment-only Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection event and Electronics Recycling and Certified Document Shredding program is this Saturday, May 11, held in collaboration with the Town of Perinton at the Perinton Highway Garage, 100 Cobb's Lane, from 7:45am to 12:00pm. Up to 30 gallons of allowed HHW materials per appointment will be accepted at no charge – please see the list of accepted items below.



To ensure safety and reduce waiting times, appointments are required for hazardous waste disposal; an appointment is NOT necessary for electronics recycling and/or document shredding only. **HHW appointment scheduling is underway.** Pittsford and East Rochester residents can make an appointment by calling 248-6250, or by going online to [www.monroecounty.gov/ecopark](http://www.monroecounty.gov/ecopark), scrolling to and clicking on "make an appointment" in the HHW section, and clicking on May 11 in the calendar. **HHW appointments must be reserved by this Friday, May 10** but please note appointments may fill up well in advance of the event; early registration is encouraged. If appointments are full, please check back as additional appointments may become available. Please note, waste from businesses will not be accepted.

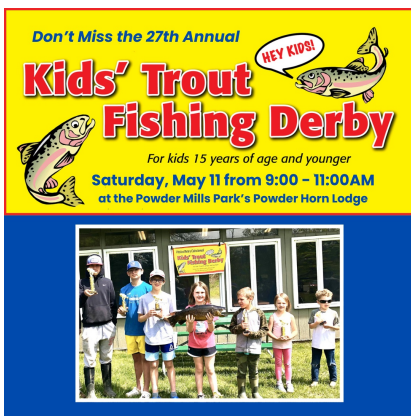
**Accepted Household Hazardous Waste items include** oil-based and latex paint, wood stain and preservatives, automotive fluids (antifreeze; brake, power steering and transmission fluids), pesticides and fertilizers, flammable products (gasoline, kerosene, thinners, strippers, solvents), household cleaners (liquid soaps & waxes, drain cleaners, etc.), driveway sealer, pool and photo chemicals, rechargeable (Ni-Cad) and button batteries, mercury (thermometers, thermostats), and syringes/sharps (safely packaged). **Please do not bring** used motor oil or vehicle batteries (contact service station or retailer), propane tanks (bring to permanent HHW facility only), cans with dried paint (if it rattles when shaken, remove lid and place in trash), empty containers (trash or recycle) or glazing/spackle and joint compounds (put in trash).

There is no appointment needed for electronics recycling, which also is free of charge. **Accepted items include** computers and computer equipment, printers, cell phones and mobile devices, televisions, GPS units, video and audio equipment, wiring and cabling, microwaves, and other electronics. **Please do not bring** small appliances (toasters, vacuum cleaners, coffee makers, irons, hair dryers, etc.), items containing freon (air conditioners, humidifiers), carbon monoxide detectors, smoke detectors and large appliances (refrigerators, ovens, etc.).

**Certified document shredding** (residential only, 4-5 box limit, no need to remove

staples/paper clips) also will be available at no charge. No appointment is needed for document shredding.

For those who are unable to take advantage of the May 11 collection date, Monroe County offers other HHW, e-recycling and document shredding options throughout the year. ceremony at 11:15am and Fish Hatchery tours at 11:30am. Complimentary refreshments will be served.

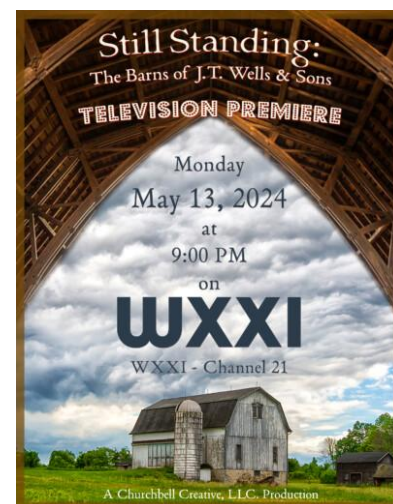

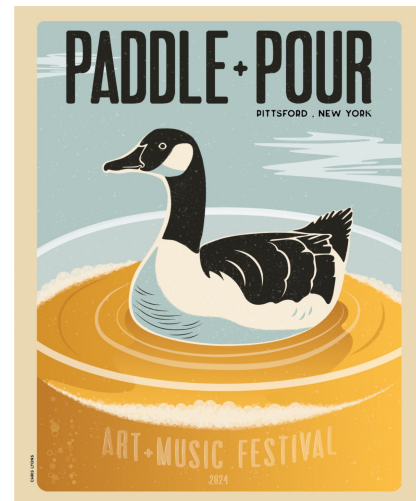

### **TAKE PART IN PITTSFORD'S TOXIC FREE CHALLENGE THIS SPRING**

If you've considered maintaining your yard without toxic chemicals but have yet to make the change, the Town of Pittsford has information to make the next step easier for you. Join our [Toxic-Free Challenge](#) and learn how to care



for your lawn without harming the environment! Here are some tips:

**Use natural fertilizers.** Use organic fertilizers such as compost, manure, or organic plant-based fertilizers to nourish your lawns and plants.

**Water properly:** Watering deeply and infrequently to encourage deep root growth and drought resistance.

**Employ integrated pest management methods:** Integrated pest management (IPM) is a long-term, initiative-taking and environmentally friendly alternative to chemical methods of pest elimination. Check out [the New York State Integrated Pest Management Program](#) for more details.

**Natural weed control:** Hand-pull weeds when they're small or use natural weed control methods such as corn gluten meal or vinegar-based herbicides. Apply these treatments carefully to target weeds while minimizing harm to desirable plants.

**Promote biodiversity:** Encourage beneficial insects, birds, and other wildlife in your yard by planting native flowers, shrub and trees. These natural allies help control pests and maintain a healthy ecosystem.

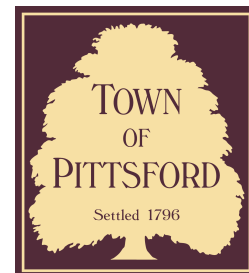
**Maintain regularly:** As warm weather approaches and night temperatures are regularly in the 50s or above, you can safely remove fallen leaves, sticks, and other debris without disturbing sleeping pollinators. Debris smothers grass: removal promotes better air circulation and will result in a lush, green lawn.
