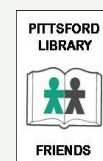

Felted Bag: 400 yards worsted weight wool yarn (note: NOT Superwash), 1 US size 10 16-inch circular needle, tape measure or ruler, tapestry needle. Bring your yarn and supplies and have fun learning to knit! **Registration required.**

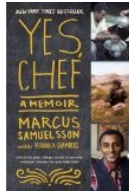
Savory Food Book Club

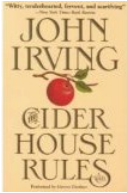

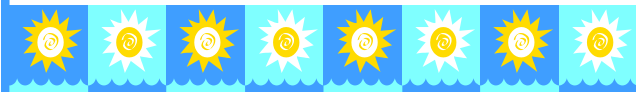

with eBooks!

You can check out and download digital content at Monroe County Library's OverDrive website.

To download OverDrive eBooks you need...

- A valid Monroe County library card.
- Internet access.
- A computer or device that meets the system requirements for the digital content you wish to download. OverDrive eBooks are compatible with many devices, including smartphones, tablets and eReaders.
- Free software for your computer or device that allows you to borrow and use the digital content available at the site.

Get Started in Three Easy Steps:

Step 1 - Download and install free software

As a first step, you need to download and install the free software that allows you to use digital content. Go to <http://overdrive.libraryweb.org> to determine what software is required for your device. Look for Software Downloads in the left-hand column.

Step 2 - Activate the software

After you have downloaded and installed the appropriate software for your device, you must activate it before downloading digital content. Go to <http://overdrive.libraryweb.org/Help-QuickStartGuide.htm> for more information about activating your software.

Step 3 - Check out, download, and enjoy

Browse or search the library's site for downloadable content. When you locate a title of interest, add it to the Digital Cart and check out the title.
