Her guidance has clearly helped elevate the Pittsford high school swim teams to an elite status in Monroe County and New York State.

This is just a friendly reminder to please check with the town's Building Department to see if your project requires a permit.



We love a parade!

he town's annual Memorial Day parade will step off promptly at 10AM on Monday, May 29. This year's line-up is bigger and better than ever, headlined by the Crusaders and Empire Statesmen drum and bugle corps and Prime Time Brass, an exciting addition to the 2006 line-up. Also appearing are the Pittsford Firemen's Band, the Marchmasters and Pittsford Schools marching band.

Veterans from the eras of WWII, Korea, Vietnam and the war in Iraq will lead off the parade, followed by Monroe County Executive Maggie Brooks who will serve as 2006 Grand Marshal and deliver the keynote address during the Memorial Ceremony.

Look for local marching units, too. Community leaders, elected officials, Pittsford fire and ambulance corps, scouting troops and town and village municipal services will participate.

The parade will form on Sutherland Street and proceed to W. Jefferson Road to Main Street to the Pittsford Cemetery.

Please join us at the Soldiers Plot for a Memorial Ceremony organized by the Rayson Miller American Legion Post 899. The Legion will host an Open House at their Post home, 21 N. Main Street, following the ceremony.

Please be aware that compost sites do not accept plastic bags. To ensure pickup, please place leaves, grass and weeds in paper bags or reusable containers (not to exceed 50 lbs.). If you have questions about the town's yard debris recycling program, you can contact the Highway Department directly at 248-6270.

Leaf & wood mulch

The town's Highway
Department recycles yard
debris in the form of leaf
and wood mulch and
provides it free of charge
to Pittsford residents. The
supply of mulch is located
at our East Street location,
adjacent to the Little
League fields and the
town's Parks facility. Levels
are monitored regularly
and replenished as needed.
Availability is on a first
come/first served basis.
