TEMPORARY STATE TRAFFIC-COUNTING CAMERAS

Residents of some streets in Town may notice traffic-counting cameras installed by contractors for the State Department of Transportation.

The sole purpose of these cameras is to tally the number of vehicles on each street for a period of one week. After that, the State's contractors return to remove the cameras. State DOT advises that this year it expects to remove the cameras on the Friday following completion of the 7-day duration of the counting.

State DOT also will be deploying the traditional tube-style counters spanning the width of the street.


We have asked the State Department of Transportation to provide us notice on a regular basis before it places traffic-counting cameras, including the streets where they're to be placed.

PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS SATURDAY, 9AM – 12PM

The Rotary Club of Pittsford's next food drive is scheduled for this Saturday, August 10, from 9:00amnoon at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop. In addition to the Pittsford Food Cupboard, donations will support Rochester's St. Joseph's Neighborhood Center and the Nazareth University Oak Tree Food Pantry. Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected for distribution to



various social agencies in the Rochester area.

The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial role in addressing food insecurity within our community. Donations help ensure that local families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. **Current needs include school supplies** such as notebooks, folders, paper, markers and pencils. The pantry is also in need of Wegmans-style reusable bags, paper towels, feminine hygiene products, saran wrap, tin foil, laundry soap and dish soap. Food pantry items especially needed include canned spinach and collard greens, condiments (ketchup, barbeque sauce, salsa, salad dressing) and spaghetti sauce.

<u>The People's Pantry</u> has a mission of providing groceries to individuals and families to help mitigate the effects of food insecurity with dignity and without bias or discrimination. They are always in need of general food items, canned fruit, canned vegetables, canned beans, pasta and rice.

The Oak Tree Pantry serves those with food insecurity in the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that can be easily prepared by students, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. The has an ongoing need for granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap, and other hygiene products.

TIPS FOR SUPPORTING POLLINATORS IN THE LATE SUMMER

During the second half of summer, pollinators like bees, butterflies and hummingbirds are still active but will soon begin to prepare for the colder months. August is not too late to start caring for and supporting our local pollinators. The following tips are for those who have an existing pollinator garden as well as those who would like to learn more about how to support our pollinator friends.

Provide late-blooming plants: It's not too late to plant! Planting a variety of late-blooming flowers provides pollinators with nectar and pollen. Some great choices include asters, goldenrod, sedum, Joe-Pye weed, spotted beebalm, and ironweed. Plant these species in cluster to make it easier for pollinators to find them. Herbs like mint, oregano and lavender can also provide late-season nourishment. Allow some flowers to go to seed to provide food for birds and insects.

Ensure water availability: Place shallow dishes of water with stones for perching in your garden. Refresh the water regularly to keep it clean. You can also create small mud puddles for butterflies and other pollinators who enjoy "puddling." Keeping one area of the yard moist.

Create shelters for the winter: Pollinators will begin looking for places to hibernate soon! Leave some areas in your garden or lawn undisturbed with leaf litter, fallen branches and tall grasses. These provide shelter and nesting sites for insects.

Avoid pesticides. Try and use natural pest control if pest management is a concern.

Prepare for next year: As summer draws to a close, plan to plant more native and late-blooming flowers next spring to ensure your garden continues to support


