## FALL SAFETY REMINDER – DO NOT PUT LEAF PILES IN THE STREET

#### A Message from Supervisor Bill Smith

While leaf piles are fun for kids and pets, they pose serious risks when left in or too near the road. Please remember, **do not place piles of leaves in the street**. Leaf piles in the street cause several problems:

**First,** leaf piles narrow neighborhood roadways, sometimes to the width of a single lane, limiting space for walkers, runners and cyclists go navigate the roadways safely. Tall piles can create blind spots for drivers.



**Second,** leaves become slippery when wet. When left on the road, they create hazardous driving conditions.

**Third,** a child or pet playing in a pile of leaves may not be visible to passing cars. Occasionally, a car driving through a pile of leaves results in injury or even kills a child hiding in the leaves. We can prevent tragedy by keeping leaf piles behind the curb. When raking leaves, please place them behind the gutter, on your lawn. This minimizes inconvenience to you and your neighbors and helps keep our roads safe.

## Early Voting Mail in Ballots:

Due to State legislation in 2023, starting this year, 2024, voters will be able to request an Early Mail Ballot. This new option allows any registered voter to request an Early Mail Ballot. This application can be personally delivered to your county board of elections until the day before the election or by mail until 10 days before the election. Early Mail Ballots can be used by anyone that wants to vote by mail.


#### GUIDED HIKE THIS SATURDAY, 10/12, THROUGH MITCHELL TRAIL Pittsford Recreation's next guided trail hike is this

Saturday, October 12. Get outdoors, meet other hikers, and Mitchell Trails. This easy hike begins at 8:30am along primarily flat, natural surface with some elevation gains. We suggest wearing comfortable hiking shoes or sneakers. The group will be walking at a brisk pace while discussion recreational opportunities, the District #9 Schoolhouse, the Highlands at Pittsford, the Auburn Trail, and other topics! The hike is approximately 1.75 miles long and should take about 1.5 hours to complete

The Recreation Department will contact participants in advance with a meeting place and extra information prior to the hike date. They will also provide a trail map at the beginning of the hike. Bring your

### SENIORS MOVIE MATINEE OCTOBER 17: MISS POTTER Reservations required by this Monday,



Flu Prevention Partners, a division of Wellness Programs with Value (WPV), is offering a community flu clinic at the Pittsford Fire Department Station #1 this Friday, October 11, from 2:00 - 3:30pm. PFD Station #1 is located at 8 Monroe Avenue, Pittsford, NY 14534. The clinic is open to adults aged 18+. WPV accepts most major health insurance plans, including Medicare. Please bring your insurance ID. For uninsured participants, the cost will be \$60 per

Trivalent Dose or \$90 per Senior Dose payable by cash or check at the time of service.

The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infects the nose, throat, and sometimes the lungs. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death. The best way to prevent the flu is by getting a flu vaccine each year.

## PITTSFORD FIRE DEPARTMENT OPEN HOUSE IS THIS SATURDAY, OCTOBER 12

In commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire (which occurred October 8 - 10 in 1871), this week is nationally designated as Fire Prevention Week. The Pittsford Fire Department will be holding a Community Open House at Fire Station #1 (8 Monroe Avenue, near the Main Street Four Corners) **this Saturday,** October 12, from 9:00am – 11:00am. Take this opportunity to learn about your local volunteer fire



department and the importance of fire safety and fire prevention.

Take a tour of the station, enjoy fun family activities, and get an up-close look at the firetrucks, tools and equipment. And be sure to chat with our volunteer firefighters – they'll be available to provide information, answer questions, and discuss all things related to firefighting! Enjoy donuts and cider too. The event is free and open to the public.

First-responders and representatives from the Monroe County Sheriff's Office, Pittsford Volunteer Ambulance, the Monroe County Office of Traffic Safety, and the

STOP-DWI program will be on site as well providing additional health and safety information.

The Pittsford Volunteer Fire Department is always looking for members of the community interested in joining their ranks. 
The theme of this year's Fire Prevention Week is **"Smoke alarms: make them work for you!"** Here are some **"Smoke Alarms at Home" safety tips** from the National Fire Protection Association:

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom. They should also be outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home. Install alarms in the basement.
- Large homes may need extra smoke alarms.
- It is best to use **interconnected smoke alarms**. When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month. Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.
- Current alarms on the market employ several types of technology including **multi-sensing**, which could include smoke and carbon monoxide combined.
- Today's smoke alarms will be more **technologically advance**d to respond to a multitude of fire conditions yet mitigate false alarms.
- A smoke alarm **should be on the ceiling or high on a wall**. Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen to reduce false alarms. They should be at least 10 feet (3 meters) from the stove.
- People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use **special alarms**. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.

## HISTORIC PITTSFORD PRESENTS "DEATH & DESPAIR: MOURNING IN PITTSFORD" - 10/23 Join Pittsford Town Historian Vicki

Masters Profitt on Wednesday, October 23 for a presentation entitled "Death & Despair: Mourning in Pittsford." Unearth the stories of Pittsford's eternal residents ... A Pittsford Civil War soldier killed at the Battle of Antietam was buried three times, and his final resting place is marked with the wrong date. A 21-



year-old Pittsford man died and so many mourners attended his funeral that they filled two memory books. A Pittsford Village family had 10 children, four of whom died within 10 days of each other of disease. Pittsford Town and Village Historian Vicki Masters Profitt will share these and other stories of bereavement in our community through the years.

"Death & Despair: Mourning in Pittsford" is co-hosted by Historic Pittsford and the Pittsford Community Library. It will take place at the Pittsford Community Library, 24 State Street, on October 23 at 6:30pm. This event is free and open to the public; no registration required.


