LEAF COLLECTION APP NOW LIVE

The Town of Pittsford's Leaf Collection App is now live. You can use the Town's online leaf-collection app to track the location of our hardworking leaf-collecting crews and learn when they'll next be in your neighborhood. Just visit

https://gis.townofpittsford.org/LeafCollection. There, you'll find an interactive, color-coded map that operates in real time, allowing you to see where leaf crews are operating throughout the Town and where they'll be next.



Our Highway Department team updates the leaf application once or twice a day, as leaf crews call in upon completing collection in an area. Upcoming collection days are forecasted based on the weather and the amount of leaves that have fallen – both key factors that affect how quickly leaves can be picked up. Give our leaf app a try – it It's a great example of our long-held commitment to making Town services even more helpful and effective for you.


importance of sharing and friendship. With its charming rhymes and vibrant illustrations, this heartwarming tale inspires young readers to be kind and generous.

TONIGHT: HISTORIC PITTSFORD PRESENTS "DEATH & DESPAIR: MOURNING IN PITTSFORD" AT THE LIBRARY

Join Pittsford Town Historian Vicki Masters Profitt tonight – Wednesday, October 23 – for the presentation "Death & Despair: Mourning in Pittsford." Unearth the stories of Pittsford's eternal residents ... A Pittsford Civil War soldier



killed at the Battle of Antietam was buried three times, and his final resting place is marked with the wrong date. A 21-year-old Pittsford man died and so many mourners attended his funeral that they filled two memory books. A Pittsford Village family had 10 children, four of whom died within 10 days of each other of disease. Pittsford Town and Village Historian Vicki Masters Profitt will share these and other stories of bereavement in our community through the years.

"Death & Despair: Mourning in Pittsford" is co-hosted by Historic Pittsford and the Pittsford Community Library. It will take place at the Pittsford Community Library, 24 State Street, at 6:30pm. This event is free and open to the public; no registration required.

NARCAN TRAINING & SERVICES INFO AT LIBRARY THIS TUESDAY, 10/29 - LEARN TO SAFELY STOP AN OPIOID OVERDOSE

The Pittsford Community Library will offer free public Narcan training and opioid awareness information this Tuesday, October 29 from 12:00 - 3:00pm in the Library hallway. Stop by to receive a free Narcan training and a Narcan kit from the Monroe County Health Department. Narcan (Naloxone) is a nasal spray that can be administered immediately to treat an opioid overdose. The opioid crisis continues at an

alarming level. Approximately every other day, someone in Monroe County dies from an opioid overdose. There is no community immune to this crisis – learn how to save a life with Narcan. This drop-in program is free; no registration required.

DONATE ITEMS AT THE LIBRARY TO HELP BIRDS OF PREY AT WILD WINGS

There's still time to donate items to help hawks, eagles, owls and other birds of prey cared for by Wild Wings. The Pittsford Community Library is collecting items through October 31 - see the list of needs below. All items should be new and unopened. Wild Wings is a Bird of Prey Facility and Nature Center that cares for permanently injured and non-releasable birds and animals unable to survive on their own in the wild. It's located in Mendon Ponds Park and offers

visits and educational programs to foster awareness, enhance respect, and promote personal responsibility related to the natural world. This donation drive is held in the spirit of the <u>Great Give Back</u>, a NYS Public Libraries community service initiative.

A variety of items are needed, including these most in demand: aspen shavings for bedding, bird seed (sunflower, safflower, thistle), Peanut Pickouts, unsalted, shelled nuts (peanuts, pecans, walnuts, cashews or pistachios), dried mealworms, 55-gallon trash bags, hand sanitizer, latex disposable gloves, litter (Unscented ExquisiCat or Unscented Vibrant Life Natural paper Pellets), paper towels, and Purina One Tender Select Blend Dry Cat Food with Real Chicken. LEAF MULCH: NATURE'S NUTRIENT BOOST

Mulching leaves instead of raking them saves time and improves your lawn!

- Natural fertilizer: Mulching leaves adds nutrients and organic matter to your lawn. Fall leaves are high in carbon and low in nitrogen, so mowing helps break them down and release nutrients into the soil.
- Weed control: Mulching can reduce weeds like crabgrass by preventing weed seeds from germinating.
- Soil improvement: Mulching improves the quality of your soil and provides food for beneficial microorganisms.
- Erosion control: Mulch acts as a protective barrier, preventing soil erosion from wind and rain, which also preserves nutrient loss.
- Time saver: Mulch leaves while moving your lawn to save time.
- Habitat for wildlife: Leaves provide a natural habitat for many animals, including butterflies, salamanders, chipmunks, and earthworms.

To mulch leaves with your lawn mower:

- Set your mower to its highest setting.
- Mow as usual.
- For deep layers of leaves, you may need to mow in a crisscross or 90-degree pattern.
- Some leaves will remain on the lawn, but they will break down over time.

By mulching leaves, you can contribute to a healthier ecosystem, reduce your reliance on synthetic fertilizers and pesticides, and conserve natural resources.

no later than December 31, 2024.


