Message from Town Supervisor Bill Smith: TIPS FOR A SAFE AND HAPPY HALLOWEEN

Halloween is tomorrow! If your family will be out trick-or-treating – or if you will be out on the road – be sure to plan ahead for a fun and safe evening. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration advises that children are nearly THREE TIMES as likely to be hit by a car on Halloween than on any other day of the year. It's a sobering fact that requires attention. Don't let Halloween be scary for the wrong reasons; follow



these simple yet important guidelines to make sure you, your children and your neighbors stay safe.

- Be visible! Poor visibility is the biggest threat on Halloween night. Trick-ortreat before the sun goes down if you can, especially if you have younger children. Choose light-colored, fire-resistant costumes. Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags and have everyone hold a glow stick or flashlight.
- Have a walking plan. Trick-or-treat down one side of the street at a time, stay within well-lit areas that have sidewalks and watch out for cars backing in and out of driveways.
- Drive below the speed limit. Little ones dart out of their parent's grasp quickly and unexpectedly; you need extra time to safely respond.
- Accompany all children under the age of 12 and remind kids of all ages to NEVER enter a stranger's home or car. Have teenagers adhere to a curfew and check in with them throughout the evening.
- Inspect children's treats when they get home. Throw away any candy with tears, holes, or damaged rappers.

The best plan is to be aware and take care. Have a fun, safe Halloween!

The sun will set an hour earlier now. The good news: we get an extra hour of sleep this weekend! The end of Daylight Saving Time also serves as a critical reminder to change the batteries and make sure our smoke



The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial role in addressing food insecurity within our community. Donations help ensure that local families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. The Pittsford Food Cupboard is currently requesting school supplies, including notebooks, folders, paper, markers, pencils, etc. They are also requesting hand sanitizer, paper towels, feminine hygiene products, saran wrap, tin foil, laundry soap, and dish soap. Food items especially needed include canned spinach, collard greens, spaghetti sauce, and condiments such as ketchup barbeque sauce, salsa, and salad dressing. Wegman's-style reusable bags are needed as well.

The <u>People's Pantry of Rochester</u> provides groceries to individuals and families to help mitigate the effects of food insecurity with dignity and without bias or discrimination. The pantry's goal to alleviate hunger and promote healthy nutrition among people in need within the Rochester community. The pantry is always in need of **general food items, including** canned fruit, canned vegetables, canned beans, pasta, and rice.

<u>The Oak Tree Pantry</u> serves those with food insecurity in the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry **include items that can be easily prepared by students, including** soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. The pantry also needs granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap, and other hygiene products.


acrylic, oil, pastel, and watercolor.


HISTORIC PITTSFORD'S TOUR OF VILLAGE ESTATES IS SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 9

DONATE ITEMS AT THE LIBRARY TO HELP BIRDS OF PREY AT WILD WINGS – DEADLINE THURSDAY

There's still time to donate items to help hawks, eagles, owls and other birds of prey cared for by <u>Wild</u> <u>Wings</u>. The Pittsford Community Library is collecting items through tomorrow (Thursday, October 31) – see the list of needs below. All items should be new and unopened. Wild Wings is a Bird of Prey Facility and Nature Center that cares for permanently injured and non-releasable birds and animals unable to

survive on their own in the wild. It's located in Mendon Ponds Park and offers visits and educational programs to foster awareness, enhance respect, and promote personal responsibility related to the natural world. This donation drive is held in the spirit of the <u>Great Give Back</u>, a NYS Public Libraries community service initiative.

A variety of items are needed, including these most in demand: aspen shavings for bedding, bird seed (sunflower, safflower, thistle), Peanut Pickouts, unsalted, shelled nuts (peanuts, pecans, walnuts, cashews or pistachios), dried mealworms, 55-gallon trash bags, hand sanitizer, latex disposable gloves, litter (Unscented ExquisiCat or Unscented Vibrant Life Natural paper Pellets), paper towels, and Purina One Tender Select Blend Dry Cat Food with Real Chicken. 
DONATE "COATS FOR SENIORS" AT COMMUNITY CENTER - DEADLINE THIS THURSDAY
