BUDGET 2025 HEARING IS NOVEMBER 19

Town Supervisor Bill Smith's proposed budget for 2025 provides once again for no increase in the Town tax rate and maintains all Town services. The public hearing on the budget will be next Tuesday, November 19 at 6:00pm at the Pittsford Town Board meeting. The meeting will be held in the public meeting room (lower level) at Town Hall, 11 South Main Street. A Message from Supervisor Bill Smith NO TAX INCREASE FOR 2025

Last Wednesday I presented to the Town Board my proposed Town Budget for 2025. My proposed budget keeps the Town tax rate flat, with no increase. Cumulatively since 2018, the budgets I've presented to the Town Board for approval have cut the Town tax rate by more than 9%. Notwithstanding the pinch of inflation, the proposed budget for 2025 avoids a tax increase while maintaining funding for all of the Town's services and events. It provides as well for

some important improvements. The owner of a home of the average value in Pittsford, which is \$302,000, will pay \$946 in town tax in 2025. Still less than a thousand dollars for the year.

Town tax still represents just 8 cents of every dollar you pay in property tax.

The Town recently received its fiscal report cards. The State Comptroller evaluates each Town in the State for fiscal stress, on a scale from 1 to 10. The more stress the higher the number. It's like a golf score: the lower the number the better you've done.

Pittsford's score? – Zero. On a fiscal stress scale of 1 to 10, we're not on the stress scale at all. A perfect score.

Moody's Investors Service recently reaffirmed Pittsford's Triple-A credit rating. Again, a perfect score – the highest rating possible. The only town in upstate New York to have the Triple-A rating. The only town of our size in America to have it. Higher than the credit rating of the State of New York. Higher than the rating for the United States of America.



A Message from Town Supervisor Bill Smith COMMUNITY INPUT REQUESTED REGARDING ARPA FUNDS

Your Advice Needed!

I'm pleased to report that Monroe County has



allocated to municipalities some of the funds it received pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA"). The purpose is to provide funding for municipal youth or senior programming. To Pittsford the County has allocated just over \$335,000. Thank you, County Executive Bello and our County Legislators!

Our Recreation Department has recommended rebuilding the playground at King's Bend Park to improve it and make it fully accessible. We need to hear other suggestions as well, before making a decision.

I'm asking the Town's Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee for its suggestions about how best to use these funds.

And now I'm asking you for the same thing. What suggestions do you have? Please remember that the funds are limited to youth or senior programming. County representatives have advised that this would include infrastructure such as playgrounds. The Town Board would submit for approval by the County any proposal or proposals to be funded by this grant.


The Pittsford Community Library will offer free public Narcan training and opioid awareness information this Tuesday, November 19 from 10:00am - 1:00pm in the Library hallway. Stop by to receive a free Narcan training and a Narcan kit from the Monroe County Health Department. Narcan (Naloxone) is a nasal spray that can be administered immediately to treat an opioid overdose. The opioid crisis continues at an

alarming level. Approximately every other day, someone in Monroe County dies from an opioid overdose. There is no community immune to this crisis – learn how to save a life with Narcan. This drop-in program is free; no registration required.



- If the weather is decent, you will be asked to line up outside. Our goal is to minimize the impact on the library patrons.


Sale organizers ask that you do not bring in carts or large bins. Please ask for assistance if you are purchasing large quantities.

REMEMBER: RESIDENTIAL BURNING OF BRUSH AND LEAVES IS PROHIBITED IN PITTSFORD

Please note that the Town of Pittsford prohibits the residential burning of brush and leaves. Fires spread when the wind carries smoldering, lightweight leaves out of firepits and toward nearby structures or wooded areas. Burning leaves is also a major contributor of urban air pollution. By-products of burning leaves include hydrocarbons, carbon monoxide and other toxic and/or irritating chemicals. The tiny smoke particulates emitted can accumulate in

the lungs, causing long-term health complications. Leaf burning is not only a health hazard for humans, but it creates an unsafe environment for wildlife and plants.

Remember, leaving a thin layer of leaves where they fall provide provides habitat, insulation, and protection for our insect pollinators! Leaves also serve as a natural fertilizer for grass as leaves break down over the winter months. Even choosing to pile leaves over garden beds and around trees and shrubs provides hibernating pollinators with protection.

To remove leaves, we recommend regularly mulching them into your lawn as they fall. If leaf coverage becomes too thick for mulching, place leaves in a pile at the end of your front lawn (behind the curb or gutter), and our leaf crews will remove them. <u>Click here</u> to use our real-time Leaf Collection application. <u>Visit our website</u> for handy leaf collection tips.

APPLICATIONS DUE BY DECEMBER 31

In addition to turkeys, the Food Cupboard especially needs these other Thanksgiving dinner items: gravy, stuffing mix, French friend onions, and baking items (vanilla, sugar, flour, salt, chocolate chips, etc.) The pantry currently has no room for corn or any type of canned beans.

The Pittsford Food Cupboard is located at 3800 Monroe Avenue (on the right, just after the canal bridge as you're heading out of the Village). **Drop-off hours** are Monday through Saturday from 9:00am - 5:00pm at door #26. **Open hours** are from 9:30am - 1:30pm on Tuesday and Fridays. The Pittsford Food Pantry will be open shortened hours on November 29, Black Friday, from 9:30 - 11:30pm.


If you have a large donation, please call ahead to make sure a staff member can accommodate you; they may need to schedule a time when a staff member can assist
