



through our Recreation Department this Saturday, December 7. Both classes take place at the Spiegel Pittsford Community Center in room 204.


American Red Cross CPR/AED is offered from 9:00am to 12:00pm. The class will teach participants how to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies in adults, children, and infants. The instructor will teach both traditional and breathless CPR and will provide information about disease prevention, scene control, patient assessment, CPR integration, AED application,

American Red Cross First Aid will take place 12:30 to 2:30pm. The class will teach participants to identify and care for bleeding and sudden illness such as stroke, burns, broken bones, and how to prevent disease transmission. NARCAN TRAINING & SERVICES INFO AT LIBRARY THIS MONDAY, 12/9 - LEARN TO SAFELY STOP AN OPIOID OVERDOSE


The Pittsford Community Library will offer free public Narcan training and opioid awareness information this Monday, December 9 from 2:00 - 5:00pm in the Library hallway. Stop by to receive a free Narcan training and a Narcan kit from the Monroe County Health Department. Narcan (Naloxone) is a nasal spray that can be administered immediately to treat an opioid overdose. The opioid crisis continues at an

alarming level. Approximately every other day, someone in Monroe County dies from an opioid overdose. There is no community immune to this crisis – learn how to save a life with Narcan. This drop-in program is free; no registration required.

WINTER SAFETY - DON'T CROWD THE PLOW

Snow is on its way! The Town's snowplows are on standby, ready and waiting to make roads drivable when the white stuff falls. Here are some important tips that will help us all to share the road safely:

- Stay back: The most important rule is to stay a safe distance behind the plow, usually around 200 feet or more, depending on conditions.
- Don't pass: Never try to pass a snowplow,

- especially on the right side. Snowplows often have wing plows that can extend into the adjacent lane.
- Be patient: Snowplows move slowly, so be patient and don't tailgate.
- Watch for sudden stops: Snowplows may need to stop suddenly, so be prepared to stop as well.
- Turn on your headlights: This will help the plow driver see you.
- Be aware of weather advisories: If conditions get severe, consider staying off the roads entirely, and always do so if a travel ban or state of emergency is declared.

PITTSFORD ROTARY FOOD DRIVE THIS SATURDAY, 12/7 FROM 9AM – 12PM Warm hats and gloves also needed for Veterans **Outreach Center**

The Rotary Club of Pittsford's has scheduled its next food drive for this Saturday, December 7, from 9:00am-noon at the Pittsford Sutherland High School bus loop. In addition to the Pittsford Food Cupboard, donations will support Mothers in Need of Others, the Nazareth University Oak Tree Food Pantry, and the Veterans Outreach Center. Gently used recent issues

(past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected for distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area.

"This is our last drive before the holidays and we want to help make the season a little happier for area veterans and their families," said Kelly Cline, President of Pittsford Rotary. "We hope the Pittsford community agrees and helps by adding these donations to their food offerings."

The Pittsford Food Cupboard plays a crucial role in addressing food insecurity within our community. Donations help ensure that local families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. Current needs include school supplies (notebooks, folders, paper, markers, pencils, etc.). Hygiene needs include Kleenex, deodorant, and body wash. Food pantry items especially needed include hot cocoa, plain oatmeal, pancake mix, jelly/jam, corned beef hash, spam, hearty soup (6g of protein or more), and baking items such as vanilla, sugar, flour, salt, cookie mix, sprinkles, chocolate chips, etc. They currently have no room for corn, black beans, white beans, or green beans. The Pittsford Food Cupboard has an ongoing Amazon wish list - all items purchased are sent directly to the PFC!

Mothers in Need of Others is a short-term emergency assistance program that provides necessities to families in crisis. Their greatest needs are cleaning supplies, including all-purpose cleaner (Lysol, Pine Glo, Pine Sol), bleach, cleaning sponges and dishwashing liquid; personal hygiene items, including soap, body wash, shampoo/conditioner, lotion and toothpaste; and baby care items, including formula and diapers (larger sizes 3-6 and pull-ups especially needed).

<u>The Oak Tree Pantry</u> serves those with food insecurity in the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include **items that can be easily prepared by students**, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. The pantry also needs granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap, and hygiene products.

The <u>Veterans Outreach Center</u> provides to veterans employment assistance and job training, health and wellness programs, veteran and family support programs, legal counseling, and a residential program, among other services. **Specific needs** for the Veteran's Outreach Center include winter hats and gloves, dog and cat food (dry and wet), full-sized shampoo and toothpaste, and canned fruits, vegetables, soups and beans, rice, pasta and peanut butter; find a complete list of needs here.

TOWN OF PITTSFORD WINTER PARKING RULES UNDER WAY


To facilitate snow removal in the Town of Pittsford, winter parking restrictions are in effect November 15 through April 1 of each year.



Parking of any vehicle on public roads – including state highways – is prohibited during this time in all areas within the Town (outside of the Village). Winter parking rules are now currently under way.
