## A Message from Supervisor Bill Smith FIRE AWARENESS & SAFETY PLANNING

By now most of us are aware of Sunday's tragedy on Callingham Road, where two of our residents perished in a house fire. We can only imagine what their family is going through.

Our Pittsford Volunteer Fire Department arrived immediately to find a very substantial blaze. Though they brought the fire under control quickly, in crises like these mere seconds matter. They make the difference between life and death.

It reminds all of us about fire awareness and about planning for the worst. So let's think about that. We can start outside, with fire hydrants.

- Know the location of each fire hydrant in your neighborhood.
- Make sure each hydrant is visible. In winter, clear snow from around the hydrant closest to you. That's the one the Fire Department will need if it's *your* house that's burning. If bushes, rocks or trees block access to a hydrant, please contact the Town Fire Marshall immediately. 248-5250.
- Consider organizing a fire hydrant snow removal plan with your neighbors. A simple plan can fairly share responsibility for keeping hydrants clear and visible.

Now let's move inside, with a fire safety checklist.

- Install smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. Check regularly to make sure they're working. Firefighters recommend testing detectors every three months – even if yours comes with a "tenyear" battery.
- Create a fire escape plan; go over it with your family. Make sure everyone knows at least two ways out of each room. The <u>U.S.</u> <u>Fire Administration</u> offers guidance for a household fire plan.
- Fill out a Residential Preplan Form provided

online by the Pittsford Volunteer Fire Department. This advises firefighters of hidden obstacles, challenges, or unusual hazards they may face in responding to a fire in your home, thereby saving critical time in an emergency.

- Properly maintain fireplaces and stoves. Never leave them unattended when in use.
- Keep flammable materials away from heat sources. Take a look at your stovetop, fireplace or wood stove. What's nearby that can burn?
- Keep at least one fire extinguisher at home. It should be rated 2-A:10-B:C. Keep it in a central location close to the kitchen. Even better is keeping an extinguisher on each floor of the house. Make sure all members of the family know how to use the extinguisher.

### PROPERTY TAX PAYMENTS DUE BY 2/10

The interest-free Town and County property tax payment deadline is 2/10; first installments or full payments of your Town and County property taxes are due at this time. Payment stub (see page 2 of bill) must accompany payment. Please include a phone number on your check.

How to make your payment:

- By mail to: Renee McQuillen, Receiver, 11
   South Main Street, Pittsford NY 14534
- In person, Monday through Friday 8 AM to 4
   PM at Pittsford Town Hall, 11 South Main
   Street, or through the mail slots (into locked boxes) available 24/7, located at both the front and back entrances.
  - For cash payments, we ask that you bring the exact amount and please call ahead for an appointment to ensure we have proper staffing.
- First Installments and full payments can also be made at Canandaigua National Bank, 18 State Street, in Pittsford Village through February 10, 2025.
- Online through Monroe County by credit card or check debit. Please note there is a 2.75% fee to pay by credit card and a sliding scale fee to pay by check debit. To pay online, click HERE.
- As in the past we strongly advise that you do NOT pay by electronic check, as these payments do not receive a U.S. postmark and may arrive late. If you choose to pay your tax bill with an online bill pay (electronic banking) system through your bank, please be aware that your bank still generates and mails a paper check to the Town, and it may take as long as two weeks or more to reach the Town offices. This type of mail does not receive a USPS postmark. Therefore, the Town can only consider your payment received on the date it is physically received in our office. If the payment is received past the deadline will be considered late and accrue interest penalties.

The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial role in addressing food insecurity within our community. Donations help ensure that local

families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. Food pantry items especially needed include hand sanitizer, paper towels, feminine hygiene products, saran wrap, tin foil, laundry soap, dish soap, canned spinach, collard greens, condiments (ketchup, BBQ sauce, salsa, salad dressing), and spaghetti sauce.

<u>Cameron Community Ministries</u> is an urban outreach center located in Rochester dedicated to serving those in need in the community and surrounding areas with food, clothing, and other necessities.

<u>The Oak Tree Pantry</u> serves those with food insecurity in the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that can be easily prepared by students, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. The pantry also needs granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap, and other hygiene products.

appointment. The Little House is located at 18 Monroe Avenue, right next to the fire station. Visit Historic Pittsford.com for more information.


### PITTSFORD RECREATION'S SWEETHEART DANCE IS FEBRUARY 7
