

#### CELEBRATING BLACK HISTORY MONTH

February is Black History Month, a time to observe and celebrate the history, culture, and achievements of Black people. Three upcoming Pittsford Community Library Programs highlight the contributions of Black individuals to society and reflect on the struggles they've faced throughout history:

**Celebrating Black History in Rochester** takes place **Monday, February 17,** from **6:30pm** -**7:30pm.** The longtime home of Frederick Douglass, Rochester has been a city at the forefront of abolition and civil rights. Learn



its history in a presentation by Matt Rogers (creator of The Lost Borough blog). This event is free and open to the public; no registration required.

The Fire This Time: James Baldwin and Lessons for this Age takes place on Saturday, February 22, from 2:00 – 3:00pm. Dr. Jeffrey Q. McCune, Jr., the founding chair of the Department of Black Studies and Frederick Douglass Professor of African American Literature and Culture at the University of Rochester, takes a closer look at James Baldwin's 1963 book *The Fire Next Time*. This event is free and open to the public; no registration required.

Jerry Bennefit, an Underground Railroad enthusiast, will give a presentation entitled **Life on the Underground Railroad** on **Wednesday, February 26**, from **6:30 to 7:30pm**. He will use maps, songs, books, handouts, and other visual aids to show what it was like to live life on the run while introducing many heroes along the way.



SAFETY TIPS AND MISCONCEPTIONS ABOUT BURN INJURIES Did you know that burns are one of the leading causes of injury in the U.S.? Every year, millions



suffer from burn-related accidents, but many of these injuries can be prevented. This National Burn Awareness Week, take a moment to learn about burn safety. Keep hot liquids and flames out of reach of children, wear protective gear when handling hot objects, and know how to react if someone gets burned.

Even in 2025, there are many misconceptions about burn injuries. Misconceptions can be harmful because they often lead to delayed or improper treatment, which can worsen the injury, prolong recovery, and increase pain and discomfort. Here are some common

misconceptions about burn injuries, with suggestions for what to do instead.

- "All burns require the same treatment." Many people think that you should always apply ice or ice-cold water to a burn, but this can cause more skin damage. For most burns, especially first-degree burns, it's best to run cool (not cold) water over the area for at least 10-20 minutes to reduce heat and prevent further injury.
- "Minor burns don't need medical attention." Even small burns can get infected or worsen if not properly treated. It's important to assess the burn and seek medical advice, especially if it's larger than 3 inches, on sensitive areas (like the face or joints), or shows signs of infection (like redness or pus).
- "You should use butter or ointments on a burn." Applying butter, oils, or creams can trap heat in the skin, which may worsen the burn. The best approach is to use cool, clean water and keep the burn clean and dry.
- "Burns only happen from fire." Burns can happen from various sources—not just fire. Hot liquids (like water or coffee) and electrical and chemical burns are common causes of injury. Each type requires a different first-aid treatment.
- "Sunburns are harmless." Sunburns can cause long-term skin damage, increasing the risk of skin cancer. (And they're painful!) Protecting your skin with sunscreen, wearing protective clothing, and avoiding excessive sun exposure can help prevent burns and long-term skin damage.
- "Once the burn heals, it's over." Even after the burn appears healed, there may still be underlying damage to the skin, and scars can form. It's essential to protect the area from further irritation and to monitor for any delayed effects, like infections or complications.

Talk with your child about what to do if they have a burn injury. Children are especially vulnerable to burn injuries due to their curiosity, lack of awareness, and small size. Early education about burn safety builds awareness and confidence, helping kids avoid injuries and respond quickly and effectively if something happens.

If you or someone you know enjoys crafting or






A committee of PTSA leaders chooses award recipients from nominees submitted by the


