CELEBRATING ROCHESTER'S HEROES THIS FEBRUARY

Rochester is rightly proud of its civil rights legacy and its two greatest advocates, suffragist leader Susan B. Anthony and Frederick Douglass, an abolitionist, writer, and great orator.

Anthony spearheaded the women's rights movement by fighting for women's right to vote. She famously had herself arrested for voting in the 1872 presidential election. Rochester, her home town, was where she helped organize various women's rights conventions.

Rochester was also, for a time, home to Frederick Douglass and his abolitionist newspapers, the North Star and the Frederick Douglass Paper. While living here, Douglass played a prominent role in the Underground Railroad. His home was a key

station on its route, providing a safe space for those escaping slavery as they traveled to nearby Canada.

Rochester was where Anthony and Douglass formed a strong friendship, which developed from their shared and deeply held commitments. Their collaboration helped shape the movements for both abolition and women's suffrage. Douglass supported women's suffrage. His work alongside Anthony emphasized the importance of equality for all. Anthony, in turn, gave impassioned speeches against slavery, was involved with the American Anti-Slavery Society, and was a prominent advocate for the 13th Amendment to the United States Constitution, which abolished slavery in 1865. Their shared vision and mutual respect helped push forward both causes, leaving an indelible mark on American history.

The two nearly shared a birthday! Douglass, who was into slavery and didn't know precisely when he was born, chose to celebrate his birthday on February 14 because he remembered his mother calling him "Little Valentine." Susan B. Anthony was born two years later, on February 15, 1820.

Happy birthday to Frederick Douglass and Susan B. Anthony, Rochester heroes who shaped American history. To paraphrase Rosa Parks, the memory of your lives, works, and deeds will continue in others.

VETERAN'S PROJECT VOLUNTEER SEEKS ROSIE THE RIVETER STORIES

On March 18, the Fairport Museum will host an award ceremony and a 100th birthday party for Mary Masciangelo, a Fairport Rosie the Riveter. This joint event will take place at 1:00pm and will be hosted by Pittsford Historian Vicki Profitt.

Rosie the Riveter is a cultural symbol of World War II, representing the women who worked in factories and shipyards to produce munitions and war supplies during the war. Rosie symbolizes women's strength and capability, as depicted in the iconic "We Can Do It" poster.



Cindy Rickett, a volunteer for the Veteran's History Project, is currently seeking Pittsford Rosies or family members of Rosies who would like to attend the event. She is working hard to get as many of their stories shared and archived as possible.

"These women did a remarkable job, and quite a few today think that their work and the speed in which they did it could never be duplicated. They kept our military in the supplies that were needed and did it incredibly fast. From riveting planes to inspecting lifejackets, these women worked tirelessly to help our service men come home safe."


POSTPONED UNTIL APRIL 12


inform, and enrich. Here are some of the programs offered this week:


Teens! The next installment of <u>Crafty Book</u>



This link can also be found on page two of the meeting agenda. The meeting agenda is posted on the Town's

minutes and agendas page at least two days prior to the meeting. Please note: if you try to log in too early (before the meeting feed is live) you will see an error message;

refresh your screen just prior to or at 6:00pm when the board meeting starts and you will be able to view the meeting. As always, ASL interpretation is provided for every Town Board meeting.

The Town of Pittsford has an American Sign Language interpreter available at every Pittsford Town Board meeting, to interpret for those who need this service. Requests can be made in advance or can be emailed through the first ten minutes of the meeting.
