



In addition to the Pittsford Food Cupboard, donations will support Rochester's Dimitri House and the Nazareth University Oak Tree Food Pantry. Gently used recent issues (past 12 months) of magazines will also be collected for distribution to various social agencies in the Rochester area. Rotarians and Interact Club members will collect at the drive, rain or shine or snow!



The <u>Pittsford Food Cupboard</u> plays a crucial

role in addressing food insecurity within our community. Donations help ensure that local families have access to essential food items that will promote well-being and stability. Food pantry items especially needed include canned peaches and pineapples (no small cups, please), rice sides, crushed, whole, or pureed canned tomatoes (no diced), flour, sugar, oil, and coffee. The cupboard has no room for corn, black beans, white beans, OR green beans.

<u>The Dimitri House</u> provides food and affordable housing for its neighbors who need support in their journey toward self-sufficiency.

<u>The Oak Tree Pantry</u> serves those with food insecurity in the Nazareth University community. Specific needs for the Oak Tree Food Pantry include items that students can easily prepare, including soups, canned meats and vegetables, and sauces. The pantry also needs granola bars, pasta, peanut butter, soap, and other hygiene products.

The Pittsford Rotary Club has scheduled food drives for the first Saturday of the month through next spring. It's National Invasive Species Awareness
Week! National Invasive Species
Awareness Week (NISAW) is an
international event to raise awareness of
invasive species, their threat, and what can
be done to prevent their spread.
Combatting invasive species is crucial for
preserving our region's biodiversity and
overall ecological health. These aggressive,
non-native species disrupt natural
ecosystems by out-competing native
species, destroying habitats, disrupting
food chains, altering soil and water
chemistry, and spreading diseases and

parasites.


The Town of Pittsford, a nationally recognized eco-conscious town, works hard to mitigate the damage incurred by invasive species in the Town's community spaces by controlling their spread and planting native plants and trees.

Recently, two community members, Sarah Sutton and Laurie Konte, came to a town board meeting with a plan to restore an section of Pittsford's De Blasé Green by removing invasive trees and planting native ones in their place. The Board approved the initiative and agreed that the Town should partner with the volunteers to help them achieve success.

Every native tree planted tremendously impacts biodiversity by supporting a wide range of organisms, from insects and birds to fungi and mammals. Trees act as a corridor for wildlife, linking fragmented habitats and providing a resting spot for migratory species. One native tree is an anchor for an entire web of life.

The Town is proud to support initiatives that serve our human and animal neighbors. Thank you, Ms. Sutton and Ms. Konte, for the time, energy, and hard work in planning and implementing this project.
