

PUBLIC HEARINGS FOR THE PROPOSED REVISED ZONING 3/18 & 3/27 - NOTE UPDATED LOCATION

*<u>UPDATED LOCATION</u>: Public Hearings will be held in the Fisher Meeting Room at the Pittsford Community Library

The Zoning Code revision process is wrapping up! The Town Board will hold public hearings on the proposed revised Zoning Code this Tuesday, March 18, and Thursday, March 27, with a final vote of the Town Board anticipated for the meeting on the 27th. Both meetings begin at 6:00pm in the Fisher Room at the Pittsford Community Library, 24 State



Street. By law, the Zoning Code must be in accordance with the Town's Comprehensive Plan.

Your voice is essential! Please attend the hearings if possible. The hearings are open to the public and will be live-streamed. You can offer comments during the hearings. Those unable to attend the hearings can submit comments before or during the hearing to zoningupdate@townofpittsford.org.

RECYCLE TODAY, SUSTAIN TOMORROW: TOWN UPDATE & GREEN TIPS FOR WORLD RECYCLING DAY!

March 18th is World Recycling Day, a day to recognize the crucial role recycling plays in protecting our environment and conserving natural resources.



Pittsford continues to be at the forefront of recycling efforts. Since 1991, the Town has been recycling tree and leaf yard debris by turning it into mulch, free to residents.

In 2019, in partnership with Impact Earth, the Town started recycling food scraps from our Spiegel Pittsford Community Center.

In 2024, Monroe County chose the Town of Pittsford to participate in a pilot Food Scraps Recycling program. Now that the program has ended, Impact Earth is offering a discount for Pittsford residents who would like to continue recycling their food scraps. The Town makes recycling a priority because it's the right thing to do and because it's a priority among our residents! World Recycling Day provides an opportunity to reflect on how small actions—like properly sorting recyclables, reducing waste, and reusing materials—can make a big difference in our community.

Here are some tips to help you reduce, reuse, and recycle:

- 1. How to Recycle Different Types of Waste: Recycling boxes, cans, and paper goods is easy, but do you wonder how to recycle certain types of waste? What to with used batteries? Old paint cans? Appliances? Visit the helpful "How Do I Recycle/ Dispose of ...? search option on Monroe County's ecopark website! Once you discover what items shouldn't be thrown away in your regular trash, please drop them off at the Monroe County ecopark during operating hours. (You must make an appointment to drop off hazardous materials.) The ecopark is at 10 Avion Drive, Rochester, NY, 14624. They are open on Wednesdays from 1:00pm to 6:30pm and on Saturdays from 7:30am to 1:00pm.
- 2. **Donate to reduce waste.** Donating items is a form of recycling! Donating reduces waste, conserves resources, and promotes reuse! There are several places to donate items, including local charities and shelters, thrift stores, and online "freecycle" platforms. And remember donations to qualified charities may be tax deductible!
- 3. Before you throw something out, ask yourself, how could this item be reused? For instance, glass jars can be used for pantry storage, for creating homemade candles, or as vases. Egg cartons can become seed starters for your garden. An old tire could become a swing for a grateful child. An old toothbrush is an excellent tool for cleaning grout.

Recycling helps reduce landfill waste, saves energy, and preserves our town for future generations. Let's all do our part to make sustainable choices every day. Together, we can build a greener, healthier future!

PITTSFORD TOWN HISTORIAN SEEKS ROSIE THE RIVETER STORIES & PHOTOS


On March 18, the Fairport Museum will host an award ceremony and a 100th birthday party for Mary Masciangelo, a Fairport Rosie the Riveter.

SEASONAL HIGHWAY & PARKS DEPARTMENT JOB OPENINGS

*Application Deadline is April 3 for the Highway Department Seasonal Laborer position and April 30 for all other positions.

The Town of Pittsford has several seasonal job openings in the Parks and Highway Departments. The Highway Department has an opening for a Seasonal Laborer (part-time) position. Highway **Laborers** perform a wide range of services for the Highway Department, including road and drainage work, brush clean up, asphalt work, directing traffic, leaf pickup, etc.

The Parks Department has openings for Gardeners, Seasonal Laborers, and Parks Patrol positions. Park Department Laborers' duties include mowing, trimming, weeding, playing field preparation, trail work, and a variety of other tasks. Gardeners maintain grounds by planting, weeding, edging, watering, trimming, mulching, and through site cleanup. Parks Patrol employees perform many of the same duties as Parks Department Laborers and are also responsible for lodge reservations, including checkin and check-out, cleaning, minor repairs, and problem-solving.

The application deadline for the Highway Laborer position is April 3, 2025. The application deadline for all other positions listed above is April 30, 2024. 
PITTSFORD REC'S ACTIVITY BOXES PROVIDE KIDS WITH AT-HOME FUN

NARCAN TRAINING & SERVICES INFO AT LIBRARY TODAY, 3/12 - LEARN TO STOP AN OPIOID OVERDOSE SAFELY

The Pittsford Community Library is offering free public Narcan training and opioid awareness information TODAY, Wednesday, March 12, from 9:00am to 12:00pm in the Library hallway. Stop by for free Narcan training and a Narcan kit from the Monroe County Health Department. Narcan (Naloxone) is a nasal spray that can be administered immediately to treat an opioid overdose. The opioid crisis continues at an alarming level. Approximately every other day,



someone in Monroe County dies from an opioid overdose. No community is immune to this crisis – learn how to save a life with Narcan. This drop-in program is free; no registration is required.


(schedule TBD). The cost is \$200 per player and includes jerseys and flags. Practices begin in the middle of August and will run through October.

FRIENDS OF PITTSFORD LIBRARY SPRING BOOK SALE BEGINS NEXT THURSDAY, 3/20


The Friends of Pittsford Library Spring
