



# FROG POND TRAIL

## PITTSFORD TRAILS

The Frog Pond Trail is a pedestrian and bicycle connection through the Town of Pittsford's Erie Canal Nature Park. This 0.35 mile long trail links the Erie Canalway Trail to the Auburn Trail through a unique forested meadow and wetland environment.

These lands have a rich cultural history, from the former Rochester and Eastern Rapid Railway (Trolley) crossing over the former Auburn Railway to the remnants of former frog breeding ponds developed by Ward's Natural Science, a renowned science education company founded by Rochesterian Henry A. Ward in 1862. Look for learning and interpretive opportunities along the trail!

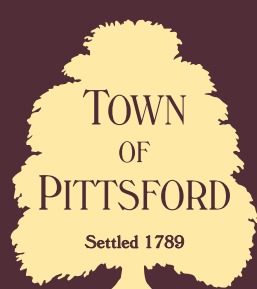
